

SR 14/Wind River Road



KEEPING CARSON CONNECTED

Keeping the town of Carson connected is important for supporting economic vitality. Currently, there are only two routes between the community and State Route 14: Hot Springs Avenue and Wind River Road. The Washington State Department of Transportation is beginning work on a project that will help keep Carson connected and promote safety for all users of the road.

Existing access issues

- Hot Springs Avenue is threatened by erosion from the Wind River. At some point in the future, the road will need to be closed for the safety of the traveling public.
- Due to the tight angle, freight vehicles are unable to turn at the intersection of SR 14 and Wind River Road.

Alternatives

As part of the design process, WSDOT will consider public input and all feasible improvement possibilities before proceeding with the preferred option. Potential alternatives include:

- Build a modified T-intersection at SR 14 and Wind River Road
- Build a roundabout at the intersection of SR 14 and Wind River Road



Project timeline

Spring – Summer 2016

- Develop design alternatives
- Determine project performance measures
- Gather environmental information

Summer 2016 – Fall 2017

- Refine and screen design alternatives
- Host open house to present preferred alternative to the public
- Conduct geotechnical investigations

Winter 2017 – Winter 2018

- Obtain environmental permits
- Property acquisition
- Develop final plans

Early 2019

- Construction
