


How to Vote

Vote for one in each race. If you vote for more than one, no votes will be counted for that race.


How to correct a mistake

To add a new candidate, fill in the oval next to the write-in line and print the name on the write-in line.

If a primary election was held for an office, the two candidates who received the most votes in the Primary advanced to the General Election.

Each candidate for partisan office may state a political party that he or she prefers. A candidate's preference does not imply that the candidate is nominated or endorsed by the party, or that the party approves of or associates with that candidate.

The election for President and Vice President is different. Candidates for President and Vice President are the official nominees of their political party.

Referendum Measure No. 90

The legislature passed Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill 5395 concerning comprehensive sexual health education. This bill would require school districts to adopt or develop, consistent with state standards, comprehensive age-appropriate sexual health education, as defined, for all students, and excuse students if their parents request.

Proposed Constitutional Amendment

Three-Year Replacement Enrichment Levy
